
## "What Child Is This?"




## Arranged for Solo Classical or Fingerstyle Guitar by Brian Johns


Here, we have an arrangement for the beginner in "C" Major" or "A Minor" that features all open-string bass notes or "E," "A" and "D." One of the greatest challenges will be in bar 15 with a stretch from G# to F# and back in the melody. Bars 18, 19 and 26, 27 feature a chord strum which could be done by the right hand thumb.
